Of particular relevance in the current global political climate, this volume reviews and investigates 'Postsecular Theory' as a well-established field of critical inquiry. It discusses the complexity of arguing for faith's centrality to human experience at a time when institutionalized faith systems are barraging human rights frameworks around the world. The book examines how the historical lineage of these injustices can be traced all the way back not to religion but to Western colonial commercial hegemonies. It models at length what postsecular literary analyses may look like with respect to works from the long nineteenth and twenty-first centuries. The volume discusses eighteenth-century Gothic, Victorian New Woman fiction, fin-de-siècle scientific romantics, Anglo-Indian colonial fiction, and modern graphic novels.
